## ***Mapping Violence: Possibilities and Limits of Digital Projects for Reckoning with Histories of Violence***

Monica Muñoz Martinez will discuss her ongoing research on the history of anti-Mexican violence on the US-Mexico border and her current work in the digital humanities. *Mapping Violence* seeks to enrich current understandings of histories of racial violence in the humanities and to offer a model for using digital technology to present findings to wider publics. By charting episodes of racial violence in Texas between 1900-1930, this platform will allow for comparative and relational histories that are often segregated in history and in public memory. *Mapping Violence* will include digital maps that mark the location of racial violence, provide curated content for site users, and distribute educational resources for K-12 and university educators.

Dr. Martinez is the Stanley J. Bernstein Assistant Professor of American Studies and Ethnic Studies at Brown University.
